

English – During the first half term, the children will be writing a persuasive leaflet inspired by our Spring Term class novel – ‘Holes’. After half term, the children will be writing an alternative chapter ending for the ‘Forbidden Forest’ in ‘Harry Potter and the Philosopher’s Stone’. In addition to their writing, the children will also be completing both reading and spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) boosters, which focus on key areas to help them with their SATs.]

Mathematics – Daily maths lessons will feature quick-fire ‘Do Now!’ questions to help the children recall arithmetic facts and methods quickly and confidently. This term, the children will be learning to complete algebraic equations and ratio problems, before recapping and consolidating previously taught content. Teaching will place an emphasis on children improving their conceptual understanding of key mathematical areas. The children will also complete maths boosters to help them with their SATs.]



Summer Term - KS2

Trips and Visitors – There are numerous fun-filled trips for our Year 6’s to enjoy across the Summer Term. For example, they will receive the opportunity to attend ‘Camp’, enjoying 2 days of activities and staying over for 1 night. Furthermore, the children will be visiting Duxford, which is linked to our history unit on World War Two. To cover key P.S.H.E objectives, the children will also be attending ‘Crucial Crew’ just before half term. As well as all of the trip stated above, there will also be a number of opportunities for children to represent the school in sports competitions and partake in musical performances both in school and elsewhere.]

Computing – In computing this term, children will be focusing on their digital literacy skills. Firstly, the children will develop their knowledge and understanding of what a blog is and the importance of regularly updating the content. The pupils will also collect, analyse, evaluate and present information by using databases.]

R.E. – In RE this term, the children will be learning about Buddhist beliefs: ‘symbols and religious expression’ and ‘the journey of life and death’.]



Art – In Art this term, children will be taking inspiration from artists (such as Yinka Ilori) who create furniture which reflect the era or culture it’s made in or the personality of the maker. After half term, the children will be continuing to explore the theme of culture through creating shadow puppets (taking inspiration from Lotte Reiniger).]

Science – The science topic this term is called ‘Animals including humans’. The children will be learning the locations and functions of the major internal organs of the human body, they will study the circulatory system and learn how nutrients are transported around the body. The pupils will also be considering the importance of a healthy lifestyle - how diet, exercise and drugs affect the body.]

History & Geography – Our history topic this term focuses on World War Two. Within the unit, the children will be learning about the events leading up to WW2, the key battles and turning points within the war, as well as the vital role played by women and the Commonwealth nations. We will also be taking a closer look at our own local history, the Blitz, as well as the tragic events of the Holocaust.]

Homework – Homework will be handed out on a Friday and collected in on the following Friday. It will consist of weekly spellings; maths fluency and reading comprehension practise. We also highly encourage children to read for pleasure regularly as this is so important in extending their vocabulary and improving their writing.]

Primary Languages – [French will be taught through the Rigolo programme. This term, Year 6 pupils will begin to learn how to talk about the weather in French and how to understand and give instructions. They will learn school subjects talking about their likes and dislikes, beginning to tell the time in French.]

P.E. – Pupils will be working on athletic activities and dance routines for sports day. They will also be taking part in striking and fielding style games.]

P.S.H.E. – The main aim during PSHE lessons will be building upon children’s resilience, confidence and wellbeing, particularly in the build up to SATs. The children will also be attending Crucial Crew.]

Music – In their final term, pupils will be preparing for a number of live performances, including Sports Day, the Year 6 Production and the Leavers’ Assembly.]
