Co-ordinator’s delivery of sport, healthy lifestyles and well-being programmes. • Contributed to providing additional sports and various activities during lunchtimes. • Assisted small groups and individual pupils with sport-based interventions. • Supported the delivery of inter-year coloured house sports days during sports week. • Promoted learning by supporting with school displays. • Supported ‘Wake and Shake’ activities during SATs week. • Assisted with the delivery of whole school events such as ‘Skip Into Spring’ and ‘Santa’s Run’. • Assisted with sports festivals and tournaments in school and out of school. This enabled a 38% increase in pupils participating from the previous year. • Delivered non-pupil day activities. • Supported setting up, improving and developing pupil play and sport leader programmes for Y5 and Y6. • Worked with school sports teams to provide additional training (as required).
